- I. Thou shalt have a project with a goal
- II. Honor thy project objectives
- III. Thou shalt commit to the schedule that management hath given thee
- IV. Remember thy checkpoints
- V. Thou shalt delegate tasks to thy manservant or maidservant or staff

- VI. Thou shalt create a picture/flowchart of thy project schedule
- VII. Honor thy team members
- VIII. Thou shalt commit thyself and thy team to the project (Blessed are they who take ownership.)
- IX. Thou shalt document extensively and keep thy team informed
- X. Thou shalt encourage creativity

The Ten Commandments of Project Management

I. Set a goal.

II. Determine objectives.

III. Establish time limits.

IV. Create checkpoints.

V. Assign tasks.

VI. Draw a picture/flowchart of the project schedule.

- VII. Direct people individually/direct people as a team.

- VIII. Reinforce commitment by asking team members to add value to their task.

- XI. Document the project extensively and keep everyone informed.

- X. Encourage risk-taking and creativity.
